

Historical Context of the Resolution before you

2015

• New York Times breaks the story of TIAA's ties to land grabbing in Brazil documented in Rede Social's report "Foreign Pension Funds and Farmland Grabbing in Brazil."

2017

- Petition with over 100,000 signatures delivered to TIAA, calling for transparency.
- International Human Rights Fact-Finding Mission confirms reports of land grabbing and human rights violations brought about by global farmland investors in Brazil.

2018

• Anthropologists, including Univeristy of Iowa's Laura Graham meet with TIAA to express concerns.

2019

- Petition with 40,000 signatures delivered to TIAA, calling for divestment from farmland. TIAA CEO declines to meet with Brazilian community representative.
- Faculty Senate resolution at the UNiversity of Wisconsin-Madison
- TIAA's accumulation of land in regions of Black-owned farmland loss in American South are highlighted in The Atlantic.
- Advisory resolution passed at American Anthropological Association Meetings in Vancouver

2020

- Faculty Senate resolution on divesting from fossil fuels and land grabs passed at SUNY New Paltz.
- Brazilian government finds that all TIAA's farmland holdings since 2010 are illegal.

2021

- Faculty Senate passes resolution at the University of Iowa following counter-presentation by TIAA
- PSC faculty and staff union passes resolution at CUNY.
- Resolutions on fossil fuels and land grabs passed by UUP Union and Faculty Senates at SUNY Cortland, SUNY Stony Brook, Suny Geneseo, and Cornell University

Problems with TIAA land buying in the northern Cerrado

- Violates communities Rights to Food and Water
- Attempted to circumvent Brazilian laws on foreign landholding
- Takes place in a coercive situation where threats of violence are common.
- Creates profits for land grabbers
- Provides incentives for and has caused deforestation causing loss of biodiversity
- Promotes unsustainable ag system that undermines community-based agriculture.

- TIAA is reported to have bought 56,000 acres on six properties from the De Carli land grabbing family which has been accused of using violence and intimidation. A judge has found 300,000 acres of De Carli land to be illegally titled.
- In 2020 Bloomberg reported on a preliminary ruling by Brazilian officials that land bought by TIAA since 2010, about 370,000 acres, was illegal and titles could be annulled.
- In 2021 Mongabay reported that TIAA had partnered to buy a property with Luiz Ricardi a leading player in land grabbing scandal under investigation by Brazilian prosecutors.

TIAA's ineffective deforestation pledge

- 180,000 acres of TIAA's land in northeast Brazil has been deforested in the last 20 years, TIAA finally pledged to stop funding deforestation in 2018.
- In both 2019 and 2020 around 5000 acres of forested TIAA land was burned, perhaps by tenants seeking to expand their cultivated area.

Still funding deforestation next door?

- In 2020, the top deforester in northeast Brazil was TIAA largest tenant SLC Agricola which deforested 25,000 acres.
- TIAA has explained that the SLC Agricola 2020 deforestation did not take place on TIAA owned land, although about half the deforestation was done right next to land that TIAA owns and rents to SLC Agricola.
- In a very real sense TIAA's farming partnership with SLC Agricola (Brazil's largest soy producer) helps them continue to expand deforestation.

TIAA impact in the US




- · 45% of US farmland will change hands in the next 10 years
- Without new policies big investors will get most of it.
- TIAA claims: "<u>Since young people have less interest in</u> managing farms, farms need to take greater advantage of technology to enable producers to unlock the power of scale."
- Rural communities suffer economic decline, loss of biodiversity, land degradation and water pollution from largescale ag

But according to a US national survey:

"Access to farmland remains the <u>number</u> <u>one barrier facing aspiring farmers today</u>, and this barrier is even higher for farmers of color."

TIAA Land Accumulation in the Delta

Black land loss and TIAA accumulation

- 98% of black farmland owners in the US were dispossessed of over the past century, losing 12 million acres of land, much of it in more recent decades.
- TIAA has bought up 165,000 acres in the Mississippi Delta stimulating land speculation in a region where Black farmers' organizations like the Southern Federation of Cooperatives are struggling to retain and recover land.

Net Zero by 2050 is not zero and not enough

- Companies are abusing the idea of net zero to use offsets to avoid doing the work of actually reducing emissions.
- For a company like TIAA, net-zero creates a market for them to sell offsets via their investments in land and timber
- This is a huge risk to land and food rights
- 2030 targets are actually the essential timeframe for action to reach the 1.5 degree goal in Paris
