The History

Tripp was born with chronic kidney disease and received a kidney transplant from his mom when he was one.

The Loy family experienced firsthand the challenges in parenting a child with multiple medical conditions and spent large amounts of time waiting during medical appointments and hospital admissions. Subsequently, the TRIPP Foundation was created during Tripp's month-long admission for transplant.

In June of 2012, Tripp passed away due to medical complications and an untreatable gram-negative infection.




Kidney Friend When Diagnosed

We look forward to returning to in person events in the future!


