Fall 2022 First-Year Enrollment Outlook



5,443 Active Acceptances/Deposits on May 2nd


5,178 Census: End of Day, September 2nd (Increase of 651 over 2021)

Diversity

- Increase of 65 Non-White Enrolled first-year students
 - -+68 Latino(a)
 - Gains in all categories except African-American (-4), and Asian (-36)
- Gender
 - -2,986 female (58.1%) and 2,152 male (41.9%)
 - 40 students did not respond
- First-Generation
 - -1,039 (+193 over 2021)

- ACT
 - -25.8 for those reporting scores on the application (26.1 in 2021)
 - -25.4 on all scores (25.6 in 2021)
 - 38% of 2022 applicants applied without a test score
 - 32.8% were admitted without a test score
- GPA
 - -3.86 in 2022 vs 3.81 in 2021

Challenges

- → The Pandemic reinforced the importance of Campus Visits
 - Travel is very difficult and expensive right now
 - The commitment to spend a day on campus can be over \$1,000 if flying, and \$200 if driving from a considerable distance with accommodations.
 - Virtual events have largely lost their appeal
 - Housing shortages have become a major point of concern for students
 - Inflation has complicated the cost of education for international students (currency conversion rates)
- → The Value Proposition is more valuable than ever
 - Why Iowa, why program X at Iowa, and how will a degree from Iowa help me to achieve my goals?



Post-Pandemic Issues

- → Grade inflation is a challenge for admission officers
- → Test-optional policies have created challenges in student support
- → Mental Health and Well-Being
- → Over-engagement following a period of disconnection
- → Funding opportunities exhausted
- → Inflation is impacting ability to pay at multiple levels
- → Confusion over loan-forgiveness policies long-term
