HR Update – Benefits and Health Equity Overview – Olson and Stafford

Open enrollment for 2024 benefits begins on Nov. 1 and closes at 5 p.m. on Nov. 15. Benefits selections become effective on Jan. 1, 2024. Open enrollment is the only time annually to make changes to insurance, outside of major life events such as child birth, marriage, death, divorce, etc. More information to come in an email on Oct. 10. The two programs are UI Select and UI Choice. UI Select offers lower premium cost, higher out-of-pocket costs, and a traditional deductible plan. UI Choice offers higher premium cost, lower out-of-pocket costs, deductible only for inpatient hospital stays, and covers providers nationwide. HealthEquity was installed as the new flexible spending account plan administrator in 2023. HealthEquity manage the review, approval, and payment of approved claims and ensures the plan complies with IRS rules and regulations related to FSA. Selling points include 24/7 customer services, faster claims processing, and a HealthEquity Visa card to pay for services. Wellbeing Update - Basic Needs and UI Food Pantry - Litton and Beecher

The UI Food Pantry has been relocated to the former Hills Bank location on the ground floor of IMU, which is a much more visible location than the previous space. The space looks like a marketplace. The goal is to bring programming and resources to the space. The previous space is being used for storage. Bringing programming and resources to the space. A goal of the Food Pantry is to increase food security. The Food Pantry is heavily used and increasing (approximately 100,000 pounds of food distributed each of the past two years) with demand from all sectors of campus (faculty/staff, 22%, graduate and professional students, 66%, and 12% undergraduate students). The Pantry strives for fresh produce, avoiding canned foods, whole foods, and recognizing changing preferences with holidays/seasons. The Pantry faces barriers including funding to meet demand, perishable items are hard to keep fresh, and influx during summer.

Bylaws: First Reading of Suggested Bylaws Changes - Schnelle
